Discussed submitting the WHSCU response based on the WHS Management Plan policies. The decision on the preferred route is due in the summer. • PC asked exactly when the decision will be announced; MPK said there is no definitive date as yet. • AS added that it is not a final decision, just choosing the preferred route to research. MPK added that the ICOMOS report should be coming out soon. RC asked about Countess Roundabout, which is incredibly dangerous due to high volumes of traffic. RF added that it is much better with the new yellow boxes but still not ideal.

Hidden Landscapes project given Current Archaeology award. Wild Wednesday events have been successful. Attended burrowing animals scoping meeting. Significant involvement with the A303 project. Rangers working on improving the setting and condition of King Barrow Ridge JD for EH: attended 30th Anniversary Conference. Human Henge mental health project has been a success, currently in evaluation stage to see whether it will continue. Winter solstice was celebrated peacefully with c. 5000 people present. Continuing the visitor facilities enhancement project; opened a new coach park SP for NE: attended the 30th Anniversary Conference. Continued to develop Countryside Stewardship schemes, aiming to improve the condition and setting of archaeology in the landscape. Working with burrowing animals strategy PC for RSPB: managing Nature Reserve in Normanton Down Barrow to attract stone curlews and Great Bustards back to the area. Partnered with Wiltshire Museum for an archaeological tour. Responded to A303 scheme due to the potential damage to the stone curlew population. GL for ICOMOS UK: awaiting the response of ICOMOS International on A303 scheme. Have sent response from the ICOMOS: UK FW for Wiltshire Council: awaiting outcome of consultation. RF asked about what is happening with the byways. FW suggested we should adopt a wait and see approach in relation to the A303 scheme. It is the landowners responsibility to clear the byways which is probably Wiltshire Council MPK attended 30th Anniversary Conference. Wiltshire Council Archaeology Service has assisted with burrowing animals strategy meeting and commented on Countryside Stewardship

Working closely through HMAG with Highways to improve it. Will be leading archaeology walks in July</p>
